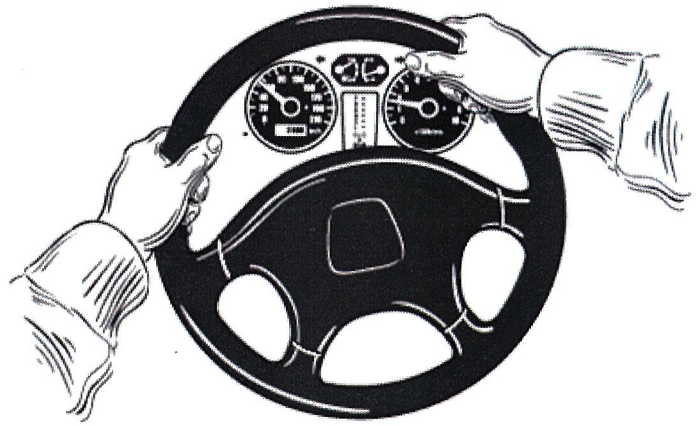

MENDOCINO TRANSIT AUTHORITY'S (MTA'S) MISSION IS TO PROVIDE SAFE, COURTEOUS, RELIABLE, AFFORDABLE AND CARBON-NEUTRAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICES TO THE RESIDENTS OF MENDOCINO COUNTY.

MTA has provided public transit services for Mendocino County since 1976. MTA's service area encompasses about 2,800 square miles and provides a diverse system of long distance, commute, and local fixed routes, plus two Dial-A-Rides and one Flex Route. MTA serves a population of nearly 90,000 within the communities of Mendocino County and our vehicles travel more than 900,000 miles per year.

MTA was established in 1976 and in 1993 entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) between, the County of Mendocino, the City of Fort Bragg, the City of Point Arena, the City of Ukiah and the City of Willits.
